What is Lesson Study?

Lesson study uses a single, live lesson as the focus of professional learning. Teachers work together to plan a lesson that incorporates new ideas. While one teacher conducts the lesson, others observe how the lesson impacts the students. Afterwards, during the discussion, observers share their data to gain new insights into student thinking and effective teaching.

This practice, used in Japan for over 100 years, creates steady, long-lasting improvement in education.
